Food Ongoing drought and a struggling economy have resulted in many families experiencing food shortages often having only one meal a day. KVEO is committed to providing (a modest) \$400 monthly emergency stipend for the community so its 120 residents can purchase basic food supplies.

Your donation of just \$5.00 can help feed a family for an entire week.

Extreme weather conditions leave the community with a shortened

season for growing their own vegetables. To reduce food insecurity, villagers are researching hydroponic gardening as a sustainable food solution.




Education

Thanks to generous donations, KVEO has been able to cover tuition and lunch costs for the 46 Shitungu students from preschool through high school. Families take responsibility for uniforms, books, and sports participation. Annual tuition is \$231.00 for grade school and \$747.00 for high school.
